Babies begin to learn from the moment they are born - first receptive language skills (understanding what they hear), then expressive language skills (speaking) You can help develop both kinds of language skills by talking, watching, listening, playing and sharing books with your baby Talking • Talk to your baby often, speaking

The first three years are the most important for learning language and how to communicate You need to know if your newborn baby has a hearing loss so you can get the help your baby needs If hearing loss is found early, your child will have the best chance to learn the skills needed to be ready for school How is hearing screening done?

A guide designed to help you learn about each checkup from birth to age 2 WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT FROM EACH CHECKUP At each baby checkup, the doctor or healthcare professional may: • Conduct a physical exam • Check your baby's growth • Assess your baby's developmental milestones, the behaviors and expected skills at each age
