The Victorian age was the greatest period of the railways in Britain The railways almost completely wiped out all other forms of transport and made long distance travel possible for large numbers of people for the very first time Every town of any importance was linked by the national network, however many smaller towns were not connected

Victorian Railways Type A Electricity Sub-Station (Former)

Historically, it is significant for its strong associations with the Victorian Railways and the electrification of the Melbourne suburban railway network as one of the five surviving Type A DC substations, which were the first to be built during the period 1914-16 It is one of a number of major buildings constructed by the Victorian

RAILWAY SUB STATION - Heritage Council

The Victorian Railway Commissioners contended that electrification was premature because they did not agree with Merz & Co's financial projections In 1910 the government established a Metropolitan Traffic Commission which also recommended that electrification should be an integral part of a general improvement of existing transport services
